Tick Awareness!

As the children play outdoors, at school and home, more frequently it is good to be aware of ticks. Those with pets are probably well versed in these little spider-like creatures, but if not here are some tips.

Enjoy the outdoors but 'be tick aware'. Remember that you could be exposed to ticks whenever you spend time outdoors, including when in your garden or the local park

Ticks mainly attach to animals, but sometimes they may bite you or your family. You can prevent tick bites by walking on clearly defined paths, using insect repellent and performing **regular tick checks**.

Some tick bites can result in infection, so it is important to remove ticks safely and as quickly as possible. The safest way to remove a tick is by using a pair of **fine-tipped** tweezers or a tick removal tool

Contact your GP or dial NHS 111 **promptly** if you begin to feel unwell with flu-like symptoms or develop a spreading circular 'bull's eye' red rash. Remember to tell them you were bitten by a tick or have recently spent time outdoors.

Because the earth is cooking.


