A Richer Vocabulary Environment


In Darling class the children's love for wonderful words has been ignited this term by our 'Word of the Week'. Children explicitly learn a new word for 15 minutes per week, using funny voices, defining new words and other exciting activities and are then challenged to accurately use this word in their spoken and written work. Even at the young age of 4, children have been learning words such as laborious, irresistible, sumptuous and towering and I was blown away by the feedback at Parents Evening. To hear that children have been taking these words home and using them in discussion with family really highlights the value of a vocabulary rich school.

Following the success of this new approach in KS1, Key Stage 2 classes shall be commencing the explicit teaching of vocabulary in Term 4.
