# Anti-Bullying Week 2020: United Against Bullying

Next week is Anti Bullying Week. During our learning we will be talking about anti-bullying and revisit the school's Anti Bullying Policy.

The school has two versions of this policy—an adult speak and child speak version.

The child speak version is based around 3 words **Tell, Tell.** This is an embedded part of our school's working practice:

If someone is doing something that is upsetting or unwanted:

**Tell** the person to stop and explain why. This empowers the individual and gives a clear message. **Tell** an adult in school. Passing on the worry and asking a member of staff to help in stopping the behaviour.

**Tell** an adult at home. Your child's wellbeing and education is a partnership. The incident may have been dealt with at school but it is important to make sure trusted adults at home and school are involved.

This year we will be wearing **ODD SOCKS** in support and to raise awareness for Anti bullying Week. **Children and staff are invited to wear Odd Socks on Monday 16th November**.

#### Parking outside school

Please can we ask that parents park responsibility outside school at the beginning and end of the day. Taxis and School transport are permitted to park of the yellow zigzags in order to pick up/drop off. As are parents who have a blue badge.

There have been a number of occasions where parents have pulled

up on the zigzag lines to drop children off. This is not safe and is causing congestion outside school at the busiest time of the day.
