Dear Parents

Update to Remote Learning Offer – Using Microsoft Teams for meetings/live lessons

Thank you for your continued support with remote learning and taking the time to complete the survey.

Your feedback has been really helpful to us as we continue to review our approach. It was lovely to be able to share so many positive comments with staff who are working tirelessly to support children in school and at home, as well as their own families. Please see below for a summary of responses.

We have now made the following changes to our remote learning offer.

- Introduction of Microsoft Teams for live lessons and opportunities to meet as a class.
- Reduced English videos/activities where it was too much.
- Updated our remote learning offer with timings to reflect government guidelines and to help parents know how long to spend on activities. A minimum of KS1 -3 hours and KS2 4 hours per day.

Our remote learning offer is based on a blended approach, as the evidence has shown different approaches to remote learning suit different types of content and pupils. We will continue to use a range of ways to engage and deliver the curriculum. A copy of our Remote Learning Policy and updated offer can be found on our school website along with a copy of all letters and resources.

Microsoft teams

As part of this approach we will be inviting your child to join Microsoft Teams so that they can take part in some live lessons or meet as a class. It is important to emphasize we will not be doing this for every lesson.

Please follow the separate instructions on how to activate your child's Microsoft account so they can join a Teams meeting with their teacher and class. We intend to start using this from Monday 25th January so please activate as soon as possible in order for your child to participate. Please carefully read the instructions as there will not be an invite with a link (which those who use Teams may be familiar with). Children will be given a link to click and a time in Seesaw which will take them straight to the class channel.


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Results from Remote Learning Survey to Parents Jan 21
