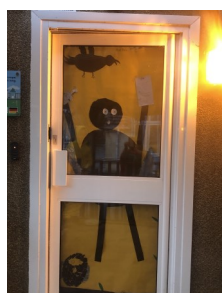

## Consultation to lower the entry age at Stanton St Quintin Primary School

This week we have started a public community consultation to lower the entry age of children starting at our school from 4 years old to 3 years old. This is with a view to open a pre-school from September 2020.

This consultation document has been sent to the school's stakeholders, but can be found on the school's website. The governors and I welcome your feedback.

A public meeting will be held in the school hall on Monday 23rd March 5.30-6.30pm for further clarification and an opportunity to speak with members of the Governing Body.

The public consultation process will close at noon on the 31st March 2020. At which point feedback will be collated and a summary document sent to Wiltshire Council.
