Stanton House Point System

What is the purpose of a House System and House Points?

A House System encourages a community ethos across the school and allows children of all ages to have a common goal. It also allows pupils the chance to engage in a house team competition. House points then form our whole school reward system.

How does it work?

Every child, from Nursery to Year 6, is sorted into one of three houses. Where possible we will put siblings in the same house. Each house also has three members of staff allocated to the house which gives them a chance to developing new and stronger relationships.

There are 3 Houses are:

Red – Ash House Captain: Niah Vice Captain: Trinity

Blue – Survivor House Captain: Alexander Vice Captain: Archie

Green – Birch House Captain: Freya Vice Captain: Anja

The children chose the theme of trees as we are a school who loves to connect with nature. They also thought trees represented our ethos of growing and developing as individuals during your time at Stanton.

How are House Points earned?

House points are given out as a recognition of achievement. They will include things such as:

- Demonstrating our learning attitudes
- Excellent class work or home/remote learning
- Illustrating our value of the month
- Being polite and well-mannered to those around them
- Participating and representing the school in competitions and sport

How are the points recorded?

Each class will visually record House Points for each child. Each week the points are collected from each class and shared in Praise Assembly. There will also be a display in the hall with the totals for each house. At the end of the year the House Cup will be awarded to House with the most points that year.
