Year 4 Multiplication Times Table Check

Year 4 will take the times table check test in <u>week 3 of this term</u> so it is essential they are fluent and ready to progress to the year 5 curriculum. Please keep practising and see letter before the half term with ideas.

Please continue practising the common exception words. The children will be tested this term to see what progress they have made. These spellings are individual to each child and can be found on Spelling Frame. These spellings are different to the words covered in class and require regular practice to master.

Maths

Children in Year 5 will continue with their CGP Maths practice book which they will bring home each week to complete one section and return the following week on a <u>Tuesday</u>.

Children in Year 3 should be practising their times tables. All children have a Times Tables Rockstars account which they can access at home and school to practise and maintain fluency. TT rockstars no longer lets you set specific times tables, but tailors questions based on answers.

Weather ready/PE

As the weather warms up, please ensure your child has a named sunhat in school and sun cream protection has been applied to your child before attending school. A long lasting protection cream is best and avoids the need for suncream to be brought to school. PE will be on a Wednesday and Friday and children should come into school in their PE kit – plain navy shorts, plain white t-shirt (or new t-shirt) with plain white socks and trainers.

Forest School

This term Year 5 & 6 will have 2 sessions and Year 3 & 4 one session with Mrs Breen. Please see end of term newsletter for dates and check weekly notes for updates.

Reading & Reading Spine

Please make sure children sign their reading bookmarks and have them in school with them everyday. Every child was also given a reading spine booklet to cross off books read, many are not able to find them, please can you lookat home before we re-print.

Pencil Cases

We encourage children to bring in a SMALL pencil case with a pencil, pen (this should be blue ink, no biros are allowed), rubber, small ruler and pencil sharpener – NO SHARPIES or felt tip pens please. **All stationery should be named.** This helps them to take responsibility for things.

Snacks and Water bottle

It is very important that children are keep fuelled and hydrated throughout the day so your child will need a named water bottle in school every day.

We also recommend that have a healthy snack at break time to keep them going till lunchtime. Please ensure any reusable snack pots are named. No crisps, chocolate or other sugary snacks should be brought into school for morning break, there have been a few sneaking in.
