Dear Parents,



## Home learning

Children will receive regular home learning in Reading, Spelling and Maths. They may also be given additional projects or tasks to support a class topic or other area of learning.

## Reading

Reading is an incredibly important skill that feeds into every aspect of your child's education, prospects of success and future life. It is therefore extremely valuable when children are supported and encouraged to read at home once a day. We understand that life can be busy, however we appreciate your support by reading daily with your child and recording on their bookmark.

## Spelling

We follow a spelling programme in school, and we ask that you support your child to learn the common exception words – which can be found on Spelling Frame. We test the children on these each term.

## **Maths**

Children in Year 6 will be given a SATs practice book. Children should complete one section only a week and return to school the following Monday. All children have a Times Tables Rockstars account which they can access at home and school to practise and maintain fluency.

## **Weather ready/PE**

Children should have a named coat in school at all times as we will go outside in most weathers. Gloves are a good idea for when it gets colder especially when holding a lacrosse stick. PE will be on a Monday and Friday and children can come into school in their PE kit on those days.

## **Pencil Cases**

We provide the children with all the equipment they need. However children in Year 5 &6 are able to bring in a SMALL pencil case with a pencil, pen (this should be blue ink, no biro's are allowed), rubber, small ruler, pencil sharpener – NO SHARPIES or felt tip pens please. All stationery should be named.

## **Snacks and Water bottle**

It is very important that children are kept fuelled and hydrated throughout the day so your child will need a named water bottle in school every day.

We also recommend that have a healthy snack at break time to keep them going till lunchtime. Please ensure any reusable snack pots are named. No crisps, chocolate or other sugary snacks should be brought into school for morning break.

- Support your child in his/her learning through practice at home and promoting positive attitudes
- Encourage personal independence by making sure your child has the correct
