After doing all of your jobs you can choose a book to look at on the carpet while we wait for the other children to arrive and settle.

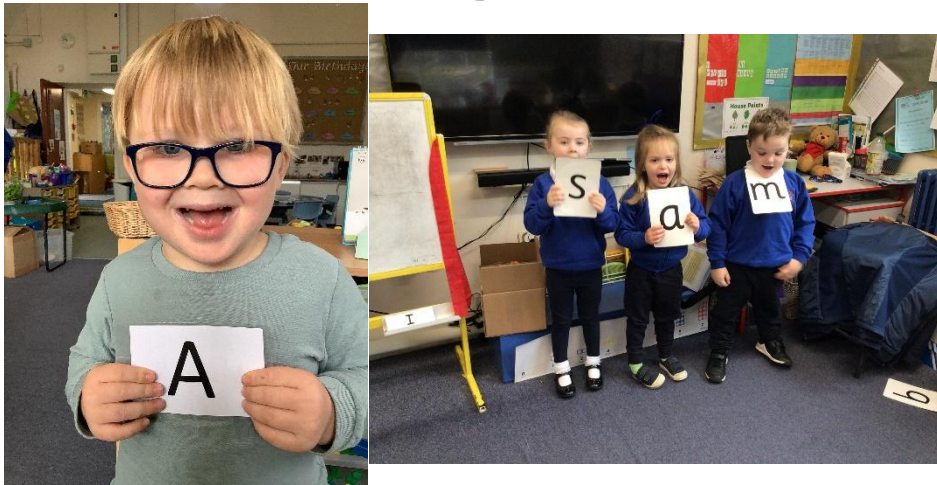


Our class toilets are just along the corridor from our classroom, where we hang up our coats.

Mornings in Darling Class



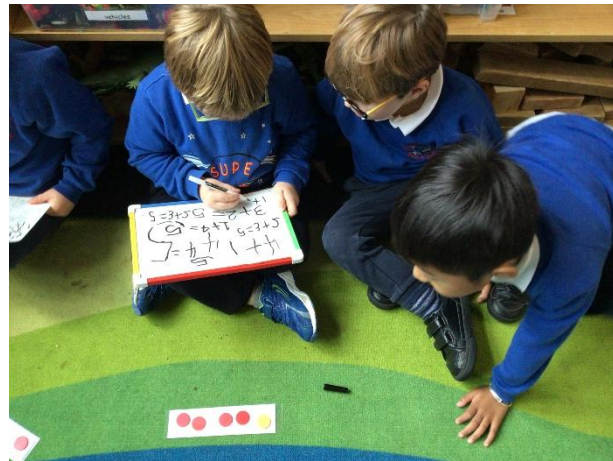
In the mornings, we begin with our phonics. We sit on the carpet to learn our lesson sounds and do fun word building activities to help us to learn to read and write.
